With its Klimalog project, the German Development Institute / Deutsches Institut für Entwicklungspolitik (DIE) promotes awareness for linkages between climate and development policy furthering a goal-oriented dialogue between actors in politics, academia, civil society and the private sector. Klimalog focuses on key issues of the ongoing UN climate negotiations and their implications for international co-operation (project term: 2015 - 2016). DIE's parallel research project investigates regulatory measures to de-couple the global economy from fossil energy (decarbonisation) and to adapt to the impacts of climate change (resilience) (project term: 2015 - 2018).


